COGWA Feast site in Orbey, France, in 2014

The Festival site for France in 2014 will be located in Orbey, about 60 miles south of the city of Strasbourg. We will be returning to the same full-board, family vacation hotel that our members enjoyed during the Feast in 2012. The site is a short walk up the hill from the center of the rural village of Orbey.

This year we are blessed to have exclusive use of the site and are expecting up to 120 brethren in attendance from France, Belgium, Switzerland, the United States and other parts of the world. No matter where you are coming from, once you arrive at Orbey you will experience a warm welcome from the francophone brethren. There will be plenty of time for relaxed fellowship around the dinner table (breakfast buffet, lunch and dinner will be served on-site daily) or while enjoying the environs of

Orbey, Colmar and the Alsace wine country.

The site itself offers an indoor heated pool, exercise gym and easy access to enjoyable hiking routes through the French countryside. Rooms vary in size, and apartments with kitchenettes will be set aside for larger families

Arrival and departure shuttle bus service will be available from and to the Strasbourg and Mulhouse airports. For those who would like to fly in and out of Paris and then travel by train to Alsace, a shuttle will be arranged from the Colmar train station.

During the Feast, excursions by bus will allow you to enjoy the nearby historic villages of Riquewihr, Kaysersberg and Ribeauvillé. We also plan to organize a tour of the impressive 12th-century château of Haut-Kænigsbourg. Additional excursion offerings will be announced in future communications.
