#### Young Adults: Challenger

The Challenger Program for young adults will be in Wyoming this summer, but unless you've read the details on the Challenger web page, you may have assumed it will be a mountain backpacking program as it has been in previous years. This year's program will be quite different. Briefly, the first part of the program will be in a very unique and scenic area known as Vedauwoo, which is not in the mountains. Here we will have a class day, then a couple of days of rock climbing and exploring the area. We will tent nights in public a campground on-site.

From Vedauwoo we move westward to the scenic Snowy Range mountain area. However, this year we are *not* backpack-

ing or spending nights in the mountains. Instead, we will stay in cabins at night and explore the mountains during the day. In fact, participants will determine *where* we explore each day! Another major difference in this program is that we will not carry heavy packs. Since sleeping and meals will be in cabins, we do not have to be as concerned with weight restrictions of food, clothing and other gear.
