### **Foundation Institute Continuing Education Seminars 2015**

Foundation Institute, Center for Biblical Education, is pleased to announce that registration is now open for two continuing education seminars to be held at the headquarters office this coming summer. Based upon the interest we received last year, we are planning for two sessions again this summer.

Each of the seminars will be essentially identical and will include approximately 30 class-hours of instruction provided by Foundation Institute instructors and administrators. The majority of the instruction will be drawn directly from the Scripture, while the remainder will focus on practical application of biblical principles.

The seminars, which are open to all adults who attend the Church of God, a Worldwide Association, are scheduled for the weeks of July 13-17 and July 27-31. Tuition for each seminar will be the same as last year—\$75 for the first person in each family and \$50 for each additional person. This will cover all classroom expenses and will also include lunch and refreshments each day for all participants.

Classes will be held in the Foundation Institute classroom, so space must be limited to ap-

proximately 25 participants in each session.

Participants will need to make their own arrangements for housing, breakfast and dinner. There are a number of reasonably priced hotels and restaurants in the area.

We are again able to offer a special housing arrangement for a few who may be interested. Since we will not be using the student housing during the summer, we can offer dormitory-style rooms to those who might wish to stay there. There are three two-bedroom apartments available. Each bedroom has twin beds and its own bathroom. Those staying at the apartments would need to provide their own linens and would be expected to leave the apartment clean when they leave. The apartments offer basic furniture, dishes, appliances and cooking utensils, and also have a washer and dryer. They do not have televisions or Internet service. The cost for the rooms would be \$40 per night for each bedroom. Most apartments are on the second or third floor, and there are no elevators at the apartment complex. If any would like to reserve one of these rooms, they will be available on a first-come, first served basis.
