Tithe of the Tithe

Years ago, the Church of God established a custom of asking members to voluntarily contribute a tenth of their Festival tithe-referred to as a "tithe of the tithe"-to the Church to cover the many expenses incurred in providing so much of what we enjoy at the Feast. These expenses include hall rent, office supplies, audio and video equipment, decorations, activities, etc. Since all of us benefit from these items, it seems appropriate that we all contribute a portion of the Festival tithe we

have saved to meet those expenses. If you are unable to contribute a full tenth of your Festival tithe but would still like to help, all such contributions are appreciated.

If you send a contribution to help meet these Feast expenses, please label it "tithe of the tithe," so we will know your intent. You may include those funds with regular tithes and offerings if you wish—just clearly indicate how much you wish to designate for this purpose.

FI Exploring Possible 2024 Israel Trip

Foundation Institute is currently exploring the possibility of a travel education tour to Israel in the spring of 2024. The trip would take place from May 28 to June 4, 2024.

The trip would follow an itinerary similar to those of our past Israel trips, starting in the northern part of Israel and ending in the city of Jerusalem.

We would tour on an air-conditioned coach with a professional Israeli guide and historian. Sabbath services would be held in the city of Jerusalem. At this point, we are planning for a group of 45-50 participants, depending on interest.

The group would likely fly out of New York City on Tuesday, May 28, and return on Wednesday, June 5.

We cannot yet lock in airfares for 2024, so we can't announce an exact cost of the trip, but we expect that the double-occupancy price would be around **\$3,500** per person (to include airfare, hotels, two meals a day, site entrance fees and other costs associated with the trip). We estimate the single-occupancy price would be around **\$4,500**.
