Holy Day Offerings for Those Attending Outside the U.S. or Unable to Attend

We often receive questions about holy day offerings from members who are either 1) unable to attend the holy days or 2) traveling outside the U.S. for the Feast of Tabernacles. In order to submit your holy day offerings and obtain a tax deduction for

your U.S. federal income tax return, you will need to do one of the following:

- 1. Give your offering online at <u>cogwa.org/donate/</u>. This is our preferred method, plus it allows you to make your offering on the holy day.
- 2. Give another family member or friend your offering so that it can be collected at a local congregation or U.S. Feast site.
- 3. Mail your offering to the donation address in Dallas: COGWA, P.O. Box 731480, Dallas, TX 75373-1480.

This year we have over 1,250 members registered to attend the Feast of Tabernacles outside the U.S. This number (almost 25 percent of our U.S. attendance) makes it important to make a recommendation to members who will be attending an international site. We ask that they consider giving the major portion of their offering in the U.S. and not at the international site itself.

We realize, however, that many would also want to bring an offering with them to the Feast (Deuteronomy 16:16), so we encourage members attending an international Feast site to also give a portion of their offering at the site they will be attending. (Of course. these are only recommendations. Members will need to make their own choice as to how and where to give their offering.)

As you consider what amount to give at the international Feast site you're visiting, please keep in mind that the headquarters office in McKinney, Texas, sends a subsidy regular to most international areas to fund the spreading of the gospel message, the work of the Church and the expenses of the Feast of Tabernacles. In addition, there are some international areas where no subsidy is received, but where we do have employees, primarily ministerial, who are paid directly from the office in McKinney.

Tithe of the Tithe

Years ago, the Church of God established a custom of asking members to voluntarily contribute a tenth of their Festival tithe referred to as a "tithe of the tithe"—to the Church to cover the many expenses incurred in providing so much of what we enjoy at the Feast. These expenses include hall rent, office supplies, audio and video equipment, decorations, activities, etc. Since all of us benefit from these items, it seems appropriate that we all contribute a portion of the Festival tithe we have saved to meet those expenses. If you are unable to contribute a full tenth of your Festival tithe but would still like to help, all such contributions are appreciated.

If you send a contribution to help meet these Feast expenses, please label it "tithe of the tithe,"

Once you have logged into the children's choir music page, right-click on each of the files and choose "Save link as ..." or "Save target as ..." to download the MP3 rehearsal tracks and the PDFs of the music.

We have permission from the composer to post these files and allow members who will attend the Feast with us to download and use them. However, we do **not** have permission to forward them to friends or repost them elsewhere. We ask that you share the password only with others planning to attend one of our COGWA Feast sites. Your help in respecting the copyright and

royalty rights of the composers is greatly appreciated.

We encourage all children in this age range to participate. Once at the Feast of Tabernacles, listen for announcements regarding when and where the children should meet in order to participate.
